JHC Refugees now helping others adapt to life in Canada

Maria arrived in Vancouver with her two daughters a year ago carrying two suitcases and a computer. This former high school math teacher had become an outspoken critic of the drug gangs in her Mexican hometown and feared for her family's safety. Claiming refugee status when she landed in Vancouver was her only way of escaping that fear.

Struggling in Vancouver with the language and trying to make ends meet, Maria fell into a depression. Another refugee with Journey Home met Maria and brought her into the "Community." A larger apartment from BC Housing, and friendships followed. She is unrecognizable today having grown in confidence and showing leadership in her community. She volunteers at the community centre, her local church and is now assisting other refugees. She also received a grant from South Burnaby Neighbourhood House to run a community cooking class where new refugees learn to cook and speak English.

Maria said, "I thank God every day for permitting me to live here and for giving my children a chance at a normal life. I love my new home and Canada. I don't feel like a foreigner here; this is home."

"You need to spend money to obtain funding..."

One of the dramas for non-profits has been the economic downturn and Journey Home Community is not exempt from this situation. This is further impacted by the end of our three-year partnership with World Vision Canada.

We believe that God's grace will see us through these difficult times. But we're also being proactive and reaching out to foundations for financial support. This can be somewhat difficult since information is not easily available.

The JHC Board recently decided to purchase a reputable foundation search software program and support services for approximately \$2000. We believe this is money well spent, but we need your assistance. Because our revenue is presently at a lower level than usual we are asking for partners to help provide the funds for this project. It would be a tax deductible donation and would give us the ability to embark on a productive search for funds from relevant foundations. Your partnership would be highly valued!

Andrew Mutuma, is from Kenya and knows first hand about refugee matters. He has a background in social work and pastoral ministry.


